AN ACT MAKING THE ZONING LAW, SO-CALLED, IN THE CITY OF BOSTON INAPPLICABLE TO LAND AND BUILDINGS OWNED AND OCCUPIED BY SAID CITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 22 of chapter 488 of the acts of 1924, as
2 amended by chapter 70 of the acts of 1928, is hereby
3 further amended by striking out the second paragraph
4 and inserting in place thereof the following para-
5 graph:—

6 The provisions of this act shall not apply to build-
7 ings or land belonging to and occupied by the United
8 States, the commonwealth, or the city of Boston.
