## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

House of Representatives, July 27, 1970.

The committee on Ways and Means, to whom were referred the recommitted Resolve providing for an investigation and study by a special commission relative to the food supplied to the students at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst and related matters (Senate, No. 348, amended); the recommitted Bill relative to residency requirements of applicants for licenses to engage in business as private detectives and investigators, and watch, guard or patrol agencies (House, No. 1258); the recommitted Bill providing for the taxation by a municipality of certain personal property located therein and belonging to another municipality (House, No. 1551, amended); the recommitted Bill prohibiting the further expenditure of funds by the Department of Public Works on construction of the federal interstate highway system and Route 2 (House, No. 1560); the recommitted Bill relative to the insurance coverage for employees of the Commonwealth (House, No. 1739); the recommitted Bill relative to the establishment of certain programs by the Department of Public Welfare (House, No. 3930); the Bill prohibiting the Board of Education from withholding funds from cities and towns because of failure to enter regional school systems (Senate, No. 325); the Bill relative to the salaries of certain members of the Judiciary and of certain registers of probate (printed as, Senate, No. 538); the Bill further regulating the filing of bonds or other security to protect dairy farmers against milk dealers for loss of payments for milk and providing that in hearings to revoke a milk dealer's license the decision of the Commissioner of Agriculture shall be final (Senate, No. 648); the Bill changing the time in which communities shall be reimbursed by the Commonwealth for construction of water pollution abatement projects (Senate, No. 1363); the Bill providing that employees of the Massachusetts State College Building Authority and of the Lowell Technological Institute Building Authority shall be members of the state employees retirement system (Senate, No. 1381); the Bill prohibiting the

inciting of a riot (House, No. 304); the Bill authorizing the Department of Public Health to establish glaucoma clinics throughout the Commonwealth (House, No. 512); the Bill to ascertain the will of the voters of the area comprising the cities of Boston, Revere, Chelsea and Quincy and the town of Winthrop relative to the use of Boston Harbor as a site for erection of the Bicentennial Exposition, commonly called "Expo 76" (House, No. 742); the Bill to regulate barbers and barber shops (House, No. 792); the Bill authorizing the Metropolitan District Commission to construct a classroom at the Trail Side Museum in the town of Milton (House, No. 828); the Bill providing for shore protection at Pebble Beach in the city of Revere (House, No. 829); the Bill authorizing and directing the Metropolitan District Commission and/or the Department of Natural Resources to acquire certain lands adjacent to the Neponset River for conservation and recreation purposes (House, No. 977); the Bill authorizing the State Treasurer to provide matching funds to cities and towns which operate a drug control program (House, No. 1125); the Bill authorizing the Board of Trustees of State Colleges to sell and convey a certain parcel of land at the corner of Brookline Avenue and Longwood Avenue in the city of Boston to the Beth Israel Hospital Association (House, No. 1127, changed); the Bill authorizing the Department of Education to maintain a school for deaf persons in the town of Shelburne (House, No. 1202); the Bill providing for maximum community use of school facilities (House, No. 1416); the Bill changing the job group of supervisor of vaccine virus production in the Department of Public Health (House, No. 1517); the Bill relative to the appointment of a sixth assistant register for the Middlesex County Probate Court (House, No. 1742); the Bill reallocating certain job groups in the Department of Correction in the general salary schedule (House, No. 1801, changed); the Bill authorizing cities and towns to pay a proportionate part of the salaries of certain lay teachers in private and parochial schools (House, No. 1906, changed); the Bill to reduce the cost to municipalities of the construction and operation of regional solid waste disposal facilities operated by the Department of Public Works (House, No. 2023, changed); the Bill regulating trucks and buses in left hand lanes (House, No. 2056); the Bill amending an act granting authorization for the transfer of certain lands from the Metropolitan

District Commission (House, No. 2269); the Bill concerning certain employees of the Department of Natural Resources whose duties are hazardous (House, No. 2414, changed); the Bill to make public certain records concerning convalescent or nursing homes and hospitals (House, No. 2444); the Bill to modify fee schedules for programs of medical care and assistance (House, No. 2446); the Bill making an appropriation for the fiscal year one thousand nine hundred and seventy, for the purpose of funding the Department of Public Health so as to provide financial assistance to receivers of property under section one hundred and eleven of the General Laws (House, No. 2470); the Bill permitting the Massachusetts Port Authority to take by eminent domain certain land in the East Boston district of the city of Boston not being used for residential purposes (House, No. 2697); the Bill relative to financial assistance for cities and towns in the purchase or acquisition of existing non-public school houses (House, No. 3054); the Bill to provide for a third assistant register of probate in Plymouth county (House, No. 3089); the Bill making a corrective change in the Medicare law relative to inpatient hospital services and providing that payment shall be made of the actual cost of home health care services (House, No. 3173); the Bill authorizing the Department of Public Works to provide roadside service facilities (House, No. 3202); the Bill providing funds to cities and towns for local highway improvements (House, No. 3203); the Bill authorizing and directing the Department of Public Works to construct certain ramps leading to and from the Southeast Expressway in the town of Weymouth (House, No. 3396, changed); the Bill relative to the subscription and sale of the capital stock of urban redevelopment corporations (House, No. 3419, changed); the Bill relative to the payment by the Department of Welfare of sums for the care and clothing of certain children (House, No. 3565); the Bill authorizing cities, town and regional school districts to purchase and improve school facilities and to borrow money for those purposes and providing for state aid with respect to such purchases (House, No. 3837); the Bill reactivating a certain assistant to Registrar of Motor Vehicles civil service list (House, No. 3922, changed); the Bill authorizing the Department of Public Health to renovate a certain building at the Rutland hospital for the use for the care and treatment of alcoholics and drug addicts (House, No. 3935);

the Bill relative to rates charged by electric companies to political subdivisions of the Commonwealth (House, No. 4223); the Bill further regulating the licensing of nursing homes (House, No. 4317); the Bill providing that certain schools offering instruction in beauty culture or hair dressing shall not be subject to the rules governing commercial schools (House, No. 4596); the Bill relative to the salaries of certain members of the judiciary and of certain registers of probate (House, No. 4648); the Bill authorizing certain motor vehicles and semi-trailer units to travel without permits (House, No. 4673); the Bill relative to the inspection of nursing homes and related facilities (House, No. 4842); the Bill establishing a Bureau of Information Systems in the Executive Office for Administration and Finance (printed in House, No. 5235); the Bill relative to the operation of school buses (House, No. 5448); the Bill placing certain employees of the Commonwealth, certain employees of municipal gas and electric plants and certain employees of the Massachusetts Port Authority in Group 4, of the contributory retirement system (House, No. 5556); the Bill directing the National Guard to convey a parcel of land to the city of Cambridge (House, No. 5567, changed); the Bill placing certain employees of the Department of Mental Health and of the Department of Youth Services and certain elevator maintenance men and certain employees of municipal electric and water departments in Group 2, of the contributory retirement system (House, No. 5695); the Bill relating to the salaries of the deputy commissioners in the Department of Correction (House, No. 5823); the Bill excluding relocation payments from attachment and providing that such payments will not be considered income for certain purposes (printed in House, No. 5831, App. A); the Bill providing for notice of urban renewal projects to be sent to the Massachusetts Historical Commission (printed in House, No. 5831, App. B); the Bill to authorize the Commissioner of Public Safety to provide for the protection of witnesses in criminal cases (House, No. 5881); the Order relative to authorizing the committee on Counties to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of current House document numbered 3439, establishing a Suffolk County council and transferring the powers and duties of the present system of government to said council (House, No. 4993); the petition (accompanied by bill,

House, No. 1070) of William Kitterman for the creation of a recreational campsite fund from license fees charged for recreational camps, overnight camps or cabins, motels or mobile park houses in state parks; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4464) of Michael Paul Feeney for legislation to establish the position of director of graphic arts in the Department of Public Works; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5674) of Louis J. Marchetti and others relative to the filling of vacancies in certain offices and boards of cities and towns and the residue of the Bill to be known as the mental health reform act (House, No. 5644), report the accompanying order (House, No. 6013).
