

By Mr. Knapik of Westfield, petition of Michael R. Knapik and Daniel J. Valianti for legislation to further regulate applications for the examination of instructors of cosmetology. Government Regulations.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Four.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING INSTRUCTORS OF COSMETOLOGY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 112:87BB of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 deleting the second and third sentences of the first paragraph
3 thereof and inserting in their place the following: —

4 Any registered operator having not less than two years practical
5 experience as such who enrolls in a registered school for a training
6 course as an instructor may, upon such enrollment, file an appli-
7 cation for examination as an instructor, accompanied by the
8 appropriate fee, and said applicant shall, pending said exam-
9 ination as an instructor, be granted by the board, upon payment
10 of a fee to be determined annually by the commissioner of admin-
11 istration under the provisions of section three B of chapter seven,
12 a temporary license as an assistant instructor, which license
13 will be valid for a period of six months. Such a licensed assistant
14 instructor may, under the direct supervision of a registered
15 instructor, instruct students in such school for the first five
16 hundred hours of his training and thereafter may at the discretion
17 of the school supervisor instruct such students without such direct
18 supervision for the remainder of the student's training; provided,
19 however, that no school shall employ more than one licensed
20 assistant instructor for every two licensed instructors employed
21 by it.

22 Section 112:87BB of the General Laws is hereby further
23 amended by deleting the fifth sentence of the first paragraph
24 thereof and inserting in its place the following: —

25 Any applicant completing two years' experience as a licensed
26 junior assistant instructor may, upon application and payment of
27 the appropriate fee, file for an instructor's examination and
28 temporary license as an assistant instructor, as set forth
29 hereinabove, or for an operator's license.

30 Section 112:87BB of the General Laws is hereby further
31 amended by deleting the seventh and the eighth and last sentences
32 of the first paragraph thereof and inserting in their place the
33 following: —

34 A junior assistant instructor may instruct students only under
35 the direct supervision of a registered instructor at a registered
36 school. Any registered operator or licensed junior assistant
37 instructor who has had not less than two years practical experience
38 and one thousand hours as a licensed assistant instructor as set
39 forth above, and who, after application accompanied by an
40 examination fee as provided in said section eighty-seven CC for
41 a first examination, or a fee as provided in said section eighty-
42 seven CC for a second or subsequent examination, passes an
43 examination satisfactory to the board, may be registered by the
44 board as an instructor in cosmetology, and thereafter may instruct
45 in cosmetology in any registered school during the period of
46 original registration, and thereafter, upon payment every two
47 years of a renewal fee as provided in said section eighty-seven CC.

48 Section 112:87BB of the General Laws is hereby further
49 amended by deleting the second paragraph thereof and inserting
50 in its place the following: —

51 No person not licensed as an assistant instructor, junior
52 assistant instructor or so registered as an instructor may instruct
53 in cosmetology in any registered school except as authorized by
54 the board.
