AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO RENOVATE A CERTAIN BUILDING AT THE RUTLAND HOSPITAL FOR USE FOR THE CARE AND TREATMENT OF ALCOHOLICS AND DRUG ADDICTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public health is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to renovate the I and K building at the Rutland
- 3 hospital and to utilize said building for the care and treat-
- 4 ment of alcoholics and drug addicts.
