**AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE OF MERCHANDISE IN CERTAIN
DISPOSABLE CANS.**

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding the provisions of any general or special law
- 2 to the contrary, the sale of merchandise in non-returnable cans,
- 3 is hereby prohibited.
