AN ACT

Prescribing Uniform Dockets and Blanks in Police
and District Courts and for Trial Justices.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The treasurers of the several
2 counties shall cause to be printed proper blanks
3 and dockets for the use of trial justices and
4 police and district courts in criminal cases except
5 the East Boston district court, in such form as
6 the attorney-general shall approve, and shall sup-
7 ply the same upon requisition to said magistrates
8 and courts from time to time as they may be
9 needed. Such blanks and dockets shall be as
10 nearly uniform as the wants and requirements
11 of the different magistrates and courts will admit,
12 and shall be used by such magistrates and courts
13 solely and to the exclusion of all others.

1 SECT. 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
