By Mr. Bulger, a petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 397) of the Licensed Practical Nurses of Massachusetts, Inc., by Noreen M. Darragh, executive director, and William M. Bulger for legislation concerning the Board of Registration of Nurses by striking reference to attendants. Health Care.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-seven.

AN ACT CONCERNING THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF NURSES WITH
REFERENCE TO ATTENDANTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 13 of Chapter 13 of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by striking the word — attendants — in
3 the fifth sentence and inserting in lieu thereof the words —
4 practical nurses — and by striking the words — or attendants
5 which if said member's graduation shall have occurred after
6 nineteen hundred and forty-two, shall at the time of said
7 member's graduation have been duly approved in accordance
8 with chapter one hundred and twelve.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.

To the Honorable the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of New York: I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your resolution, passed on the 12th inst., relative to the appointment of a commission to inquire into the condition of the State of New York, and to report thereon to the next session of the Legislature.

The Commission of Inquiry

Resolved, That the said Commission be composed of the following members, to-wit:

John Jay, Governor; John Jay, Chief Justice of the Court of Sessions; and John Jay, Chief Justice of the Court of Appeals.

And that the said Commission be authorized to hold public hearings on the subject of the said resolution, and to receive and consider the evidence presented to them thereon.
