## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING FREE TUITION FOR RESIDENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH AT STATE COLLEGES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any other provisions of law to the con-  
2 trary, no tuition charge shall be made to any student who is a  
3 resident of the commonwealth at any state college including  
4 the University of Massachusetts.

Report of the Commission on the Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government

The Commission on the Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government was organized by Executive Order on July 1, 1955. Its purpose was to study the organization of the Executive Branch of the Federal Government and to recommend such changes as would improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Government.

The Commission's report, published in 1955, contained a number of recommendations for reorganizing the Executive Branch. These recommendations were largely adopted by the President in his reorganization plan of 1955.
