RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF BUILDING SUITABLE ACCESS ROADS TO ROUTES 1, 95, 114 AND 128 FROM THE CITY OF SALEM AND THE TOWNS OF MARBLEHEAD AND SWAMPSCOTT.

1 *Resolved*, That an unpaid special commission consisting of
2 two members of the senate, three members of the house of rep-
3 resentatives, the commissioner of public works or his designee,
4 the mayors of Salem, Lynn and Peabody or their designees, a
5 member of the boards of selectmen of the towns of Marblehead
6 and Swampscott or their designees, and four persons to be ap-
7 pointed by the governor, is hereby established for the purpose
8 of making an investigation and study relative to the building of
9 suitable access roads to Routes 1, 95, 114 and 128 from the city
10 of Salem and the towns of Marblehead and Swampscott.

The Constitution of the State

In the Year 1870

1. The Constitution of the State shall be supreme and any law inconsistent therewith shall be void.
2. The Legislature shall have the power to pass bills for the raising and expending of the public money.
3. The Governor shall have the power to pardon and reprieve.
4. The Judges shall have the power to hold court and to issue writs.
5. The Electors shall have the power to elect the Governor and Judges.
6. The Electors shall have the power to elect members of the Legislature.
7. The Electors shall have the power to elect members of the Executive Council.
8. The Electors shall have the power to elect members of the Senate.
9. The Electors shall have the power to elect members of the House of Representatives.
10. The Electors shall have the power to elect members of the State Board of Education.
