AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE USE OF FLETCHER FIELD, SO CALLED, IN THE TOWN OF FRANKLIN, FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The town of Franklin is hereby authorized to set

- 3 for school purposes.
