

HOUSE No. 3376

By Messrs. Belmonte of Framingham and Golden of Framingham, petition of Robert A. Belmonte and James L. Golden, Jr., for increasing the amount of the total assessed value of real estate which may be owned by certain elderly persons otherwise entitled to real estate tax exemptions. Taxation.

AN ACT INCREASING THE AMOUNT OF THE TOTAL ASSESSED VALUE OF ALL REAL PROPERTY WHICH MAY BE OWNED BY CERTAIN ELDERLY PERSONS OTHERWISE ENTITLED TO REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 5 of chapter 59 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out clause (B) as amended by chap-
3 ter 728 of the acts of 1966, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following clause:—

5 (B) that the total assessed value of all real property owned by
6 such person or his spouse or by them jointly does not exceed
7 thirty thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall apply to taxes assessed for the year
2 nineteen hundred and sixty-nine and subsequent years.
