Putnam of Wayland, Massachusetts eligible for appointment as a regular police officer of the town of Wayland (House No. 5766) reports recommending that the same be amended by substituting therefor a new draft entitled An Act providing that Carl E. Putnam shall, notwithstanding certain maximum age requirements, be eligible for appointment as a regular police officer in the town of Wayland (Senate No. 1830) and that, when so amended, the same will be correctly drawn.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy-seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CARL E. PUTNAM SHALL, NOTWITHSTANDING CERTAIN MAXIMUM AGE REQUIREMENTS, BE ELIGIBLE FOR APPOINTMENT AS A REGULAR POLICE OFFICER IN THE TOWN OF WAYLAND.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Notwithstanding any rule of law to the contrary regulating
- 2 the maximum age for applicants for appointment as a regular
- 3 police officer, Carl E. Putnam, who has served the town of
- 4 Wayland as a permanent intermittent police officer since
- 5 nineteen hundred and sixty-seven, shall be eligible for certifi-
- 6 cation and appointment as a regular police officer in said town;
- 7 provided he meets all other requirements other than the
- 8 requirement as to age.
