AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO REIMBURSE THE TOWN OF SANDISFIELD IN FIGHTING A FOREST FIRE DURING NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FOUR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation of the com-
2 monwealth, there shall be allowed and paid out of the state
3 treasury the sum of forty-three hundred and forty dollars to the
4 town of Sandisfield as reimbursement for expenses incurred
5 fighting a forest fire during the year nineteen hundred and
6 sixty-four.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1, Clause 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
