AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO RECONSTRUCT SMITH FIELD ROAD IN THE HYDE PARK DISTRICT OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission
2 is hereby authorized and directed to reconstruct Smith
3 Field road in the Stony Brook reservation in the Hyde
4 Park district of the city of Boston. For such purpose
5 the said commission may expend such sums as may
6 hereinafter be appropriated therefor.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
