AN ACT

In addition to "An Act concerning Mortgages of Personal Property."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 In all mortgages of personal property, when the
2 mortgagor shall have removed beyond the limits of
3 this Commonwealth, and there shall be no attorney,
4 assignee, or other legal representative of the mortgagor,
5 and no person in possession of the mortgaged prop-
6 erty claiming the same, known to the mortgagee,
7 upon whom notice of intention to foreclose can be
8 served under the provisions of the seventy-second
9 chapter of the statute of one thousand eight hundred
10 and forty-three, the notice therein provided may be

11 given by a publication of the notice of foreclosure
12 at least once a week, for three several weeks, the first
13 publication to be not less than ninety days previous
14 to the foreclosure, and the last within one week of
15 the time appointed therefor.

16 The said publication to be made in one of the prin-
17 cipal newspapers of the cities or towns where, by
18 law, the said notice is to be recorded ; and if there
19 be no paper published in such cities or towns, then
20 in one of the principal newspapers in the county or
21 counties where such property is situated ; and to be
22 also recorded in the city or town clerk's office, as
23 provided in said statute.
