Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section five of chapter fifty-nine of the General
2 Laws, as amended by section four of chapter one
3 hundred and fourteen of the acts of nineteen hun-
4 dred and thirty-two, is hereby further amended by
5 adding at the end thereof the following new clause:—
6 Thirty-sixth, Property to the amount of three thou-
7 sand dollars used for dwelling purposes by the owner
8 if said owner is in needy circumstances.
