AN ACT REGULATING THE RIGHTS OF MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES WHO WERE LAID OFF IN THE YEARS NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE AND NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-TWO.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 In any city or town which accepts this act, any municipal em-
2 ployee whose employment was terminated in nineteen hundred and
3 eighty-one or nineteen hundred and eighty-two due to a reduction
4 in force and subsequently was reinstated to his former position on
5 or before July first, nineteen hundred and eighty-three, shall be
6 credited with active service for such period of unemployment. Such
7 credited service shall be included as part of his length of service, and
8 shall be applied to his seniority, promotional examinations and
9 retirement; provided however, that said municipal employee shall
10 be required to pay into the annuity savings fund of the retirement
11 system in one sum, or in installments upon conditions as the retire-
12 ment board shall prescribe, an amount equal to the accumulated
13 regular deductions withdrawn by him, if any, with the regular
14 interest to his date of reinstatement.
