The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

Ordered, That the committee on Insurance is hereby authorized to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the subject matter of Senate Document numbered 239, relative to prohibiting certain provisions in fire insurance policies relative to the payment of premiums. Said committee may travel within and without the Commonwealth and may expend for clerical and other assistance such sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall report to the General Court the results of its study and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the first Wednesday of December in the current year.
