AN ACT

Relating to Writs issued by Police and District
Courts.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 SECTION 1. When one of several defendants
2 resides within the district of any police or district
3 court, the writ issued by such court may run into
4 any county and be served on the defendant or
5 defendants fourteen days at least before its return
6 day, in like manner as if issued by the superior
7 court.

1 SECT. 2. Section sixteen of chapter one hun-
2 dred and fifty-four of the Public Statutes is
3 hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not affect
4 any action now pending.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
