Chapter 207. AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE PAYMENT OF CRIMINAL FINES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 279 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 1986 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out, in line 9, the word "fifteen" and inserting in place thereof the words:- two hundred.

Chapter 208. AN ACT DESIGNATING THE SECOND WEDNESDAY OF APRIL AS GEORGE DEMETER DAY, IN HONOR OF HIS OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION TO THE PARLIAMEN-TARY PROCESS.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The governor shall annually issue a proclamation setting apart the second Wednesday in April, April being the month designated as National Parliamentary Month, as George Demeter Day, in honor of George Demeter's contributions to the parliamentary process and his dedication to the protection of the rights of individuals by insuring an orderly process by which all organizations and deliberative bodies can make decisions.
