Key Accomplishments of Reporting Year:

-Significantly expanded Prostate Cancer Awareness events in partnership with AdMeTech Foundation, Brockton Area Branch NAACP and community churches. Sponsored and participated in three outreach events in 2019. To raise awareness among those most impacted, the events were moved into the community. GSMC partnered with churches in the City of Brockton. Members of the congregations were invited to post-Sunday service educational luncheons to inform and educate them on the elevated risk for prostate cancer and importance of screenings.

-Expanded Steward Farmer's Market Voucher Program to provide direct support to families in need at the Brockton Farmer's Market, Brockton Neighborhood Health Center and additional food pantries in the greater Brockton area. Also increased healthy nutrition education programs at Brockton Farmer's Market. Clinical nutrition personnel provided education, recipes and food samples. Interpreter services were also offered.

-Developed a new partnership with Old Colony YMCA to provide support for the YMCA's Brockton Mental Health Clinic. The clinic provides both adult and youth mental health services regardless of ability to pay. The program serves vulnerable populations including veterans, people experiencing homelessness, domestic violence victims and youth in the court system.

-Continued our partnership with the Boys & Girls Club of Metro South to promote healthy living through both chronic disease prevention and behavioral health programming.

-Partnered with Family and Community Resources to support their Brockton Area High Risk Initiative (BAHRI) Coordination program. BAHRI supports individuals and families struggling complex issues that impact their safety and well-being.

-Expanded our partnership with Alpha Kappa Alpha, Psi Iota Omega chapter, an African American Women's Sorority, to build upon our work for heart health awareness. Developed a new program for GSMC's Treat Yourself Well program in partnership with The Sorority. This new initiative included a public service education video featuring the Medical Director of GSMC Women's Imaging Center and the President of the local chapter of The Sorority. The video was widely promoted through social media and a direct mail program.

-Developed a new partnership with Old Colony Elder Services to support their Supportive Housing sites in Brockton, Abington and Hanson that house about 900 residents. The program provides necessities of living (ex: new mattress for resident, basic supplies for individuals transferring from homeless shelter, or air conditioners for vulnerable seniors) and offers wellness and nutrition programs that will improve the quality of life for residents while decreasing their risk of isolation.

-Expanded our partnership with Father Bill's MainSpring to include support for their transitional housing program.

-Continued to provide significant support to the BAMSI Helpline, a program of Brockton Area Multi Services Inc. which links members of the community with basic needs, essential services and financial assistance.

Plans for Next Reporting Year:

As we close out reporting for 2019. Our 2020 Community benefits program was going to build upon some of the new programs started in 2019. With the widespread impact of the COVID-19 Pandemic, our community benefits program will obviously require adjustment based on the critical shift in priorities and the changes in delivery of care and community outreach options.
