AN ACT

To incorporate the Saint Joseph's Home for Destitute
Servant Girls.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
tives, in General Court assembled, and by the authority of
the same, as follows:—*

1 SECT. 1. H. S. Everett, Richard S. Fay, F. H.
2 Jackson, their associates and successors, are hereby
3 made a corporation by the name of the Saint Joseph's
4 Home for Sick and Destitute Servant Girls, for the
5 purposes of providing a home and otherwise aiding
6 and assisting sick and destitute servant girls; with
7 all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the
8 duties, liabilities and restrictions set forth in the gen-
9 eral laws which are or may be in force and applicable
10 to such corporations.

1 SECT. 2. Said corporation may hold real and per-
2 sonal property for the purposes set forth in the first
3 section of this act, not exceeding one hundred and
4 fifty thousand dollars.

1 SECT. 3. This act shall take effect upon its pas-
2 sage.
