

HOUSE No. 1741

By Mr. Bowler of Springfield, petition of James J. Bowler that the Department of Natural Resources be authorized to construct and maintain a swimming pool in Van Horn Park in the city of Springfield. Natural Resources and Agriculture.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES TO CONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN A SWIMMING POOL IN VAN HORN PARK IN THE CITY OF SPRINGFIELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of natural resources is hereby authorized
- 2 and directed to construct and maintain swimming pools in Van
- 3 Horn park and Marshall Roy playground in the city of Spring-
- 4 field. For said purposes said department may expend such sums
- 5 as may be appropriated therefor.

The House of Representatives of the United States of America do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the original as the same appears in the records of the House of Representatives.

Section of the Constitution

Article I, Section 8, Clause 1

To lay and collect Taxes on Imports, Exports, and on the Commerce among the States; and on the Income from all Sources, but Taxes on Imports and Exports shall be uniform in all the States.

The House of Representatives shall have the sole Power of Taxing, but the Senate shall concur in the same.

The House of Representatives shall have the sole Power of Impeachment, but the Senate shall have the sole Power to try all Impeachments, and when sitting for that Purpose shall have the Authority to suspend the Impeachment from Office, and to disqualify the Impeached Person from holding any Office of Honor, Trust or Profit under the United States, but Judgment in Cases of Impeachment shall not extend further than to removal from Office, and disqualification as aforesaid; and no Party impeached shall be subject to the same Trial and Punishment as in Cases of Criminal Offenses.
