DECISION

**HOST INTERNATIONAL INC. D/B/A BONFIRE
LOGAN AIRPORT TERMINAL B
BOSTON, MA 02201
LICENSE#: 0116-02017

Host International Inc. d/b/a Bonfire (the "Licensee") holds an alcohol license issued pursuant to M.G.L. c. 138, § 12. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (the "Commission") held a hearing on Tuesday, February 13, 2018, regarding an alleged violation of 204 CMR 2.05 (2) – Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the Licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Di Cicco's Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Investigator Di Cicco's Compliance Check Field Report; and
2. Licensee's Stipulation of Facts.
 - A. TIPS Certificate for P. Charles; and
 - B. Licensee's Sale & Service Policy for Adult Beverages.

There is one (1) audio recording of this hearing.

The Commission took Administrative Notice of the Licensee's record.

FACTS


1. On Tuesday, August 8, 2017, at approximately 5:49 p.m., Investigators Wilichoski and Di Cicco ("Investigators") investigated the business Host International Inc. d/b/a Bonfire.
2. An underage operative, working with Investigators, purchased from the Licensee an alcoholic beverage, a Coors Light beer, for seven dollars and thirty-five cents (\$7.35). The underage operative was not asked for identification.

CONCLUSION


Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the Licensee violated 204 CMR 2.05 (2) Permitting an illegality on the licensed premises, to wit: M.G.L. c. 138, § 34 – Sale or delivery of an alcoholic beverage to a person under twenty-one (21) years of age. As the Licensee has been in business more than 10 years with no prior violation, the Commission issues a **WARNING**.
