The committee on Health Care, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 498) of Louis P. Bertonazzi for legislation to provide for substantive reviews of determination of need; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 522) of Robert J. Rohan and John P. Burke for legislation relative to determination of need; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 884) of Iris K. Holland for legislation to establish in the Executive Office of Human Services a determination of need review committee; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5511) of Mary Jane Gibson relative to the time limits for action upon determination of need applications for health care facilities; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5800) of Mary Jane Gibson for legislation to exempt the purchase of computerized axial tomography scanners from the provisions of the determination of need law, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 6512) ought to be adopted.

Ordered, That the committee on health care is hereby authorized to conduct an investigation and study of the determination of need certification process; said study to include examination of the current Senate document numbers: 498, relative to substantive reviews of determination of need; 522, relative to determination of need; the current House documents numbers: 884, relative to establishing a determination of need review committee; 5511, relative to the time limits for action upon determination of need applications for health care facilities and; 5800, relative to exempting the purchase of computerized axial tomography scanners from the provisions of the determination of need law. Said committee may report to the General Court from time to time, by filing its recommendations, together with drafts of legislation, if any, with the clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the first Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and eighty.
