Procedural History

This matter came before the State Building Code Appeals Board ("Board") on the Appellant's appeal filed pursuant to 780 CMR 122.1. In accordance with 780 CMR 122.3, the Appellant requested that the Board grant a variance requesting the use of 2009 IBC as opposed to 7th edition for 1 Adele Drive/64 Industrial Parkway, Woburn, MA. In accordance with GL c. 30A, §§10 & 11; GL c. 143, §100; 801 CMR 1.02 *et. seq.*; and 780 CMR 122.3.4; the Board convened a public hearing on September 3, 2009 where all interested parties were provided with an opportunity to testify and present evidence to the Board. Daniel Leary appeared and testified.

Discussion

After discussion the appellant withdrew the request for a variance to the 7th edition 780 CMR. The decision to withdraw the request was due to the fact there was no longer a need for a variance. There was a motion and second to dismiss this case and a board vote was taken, which was unanimous.

Conclusion

The Appellant's request for a variance to the 780 CMR is hereby **dismissed** as described in the discussion above and so ordered² on this date: September 3, 2009.
