AN ACT EXTENDING THE DEFINITION OF "VETERAN" RELATIVE TO TUITION FEES AT STATE COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1A of chapter 73 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by section 6 of chapter 642 of the acts of 1963,
3 is hereby further amended by adding at the end the following
4 paragraph:—

5 For purposes of this section, the word "Veteran" shall have
6 the following meaning:—Any person who (a) is a veteran as
7 defined in clause Forty-third of section seven of chapter four;
8 or (b) meets all the requirements of said clause Forty-third
9 except that instead of performing wartime service as so defined
10 he has served on active duty in the armed services of the
11 United States from the close of World War II to the close of
12 the police action in Korea, and has received a discharge or
13 release, other than a dishonorable one, from such service.
