*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Clause (2) of section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws,  
2 as appearing in section 2 of chapter 616 of the acts of 1962, is  
3 hereby amended by inserting after the word "week", in line 3,  
4 the following:—, or such store or shop is located in a  
5 recreational area.
