*Ordered*, That the Legislative Research Bureau be required to make an investigation and study relative to the right of State, County, and municipal employees to solicit campaign contributions as substantially set forth in Senate No. 332 of 1982.

Such study shall specifically include, but not be limited to all laws regulating contributions by public employees. Said study shall compare Mass. laws with other state laws regulating solicitation of campaign contributions by public employees. Said bureau shall file its report with the Clerk of the House of Representatives on or before the last Wednesday of November, nineteen hundred and eighty-two.
