AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses of the State Board of Conciliation and Arbitration.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are
2 appropriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the
3 commonwealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the
4 salaries and expenses of the state board of concilia-
5 tion and arbitration, for the fiscal year ending on
6 the thirtieth day of November, nineteen hundred
7 and twelve, to wit: —

8 For the salaries of the members, seventy-five hun-
9 dred dollars. (Acts 1909, ch. 514.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$7,500.)

10 For the salary of the secretary, fifteen hundred
11 dollars. (Acts 1909, ch. 514, sect. 10.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$1,500.)

12 For travelling, incidental and contingent ex-
13 penses, including printing and binding the annual
14 report and the compensation of expert assistants, a

15 sum not exceeding fifteen thousand dollars. (Acts
16 1902, ch. 438.)

(Appropriation 1911, \$15,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its
2 passage.
