The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Two.

An Act providing for the Care, Control and Maintenance by the Metropolitan District Commission of Certain Areas of Street Intersections within the Lines of the Old Colony Boulevard in the City of Boston.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby
2 authorized and directed to take over the care, control
3 and maintenance of so much of the areas of the several
4 ways intersecting the Old Colony boulevard, so
5 called, in the city of Boston, beginning with and
6 including Taylor street at its junction with Neponset
7 avenue and ending with and including Freeport
8 street at its more easterly point of intersection with
9 said boulevard, as lie within the outer lines of said
10 boulevard, and shall have over such areas all the
11 powers and authority and be subject to the liability
12 now conferred and imposed upon said commission
13 in respect to the care, control and maintenance of
14 roadways and boulevards under its care and control.
15 Said areas shall be maintained as public highways,
16 and the cost of maintenance thereof shall be paid as
17 a part of the cost of maintenance of said boulevard.
