RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING CONGRESS IN FAVOR OF THE IMMEDIATE PASSAGE OF LEGISLATION PROVIDING FOR AMENDMENTS TO THE SOCIAL SECURITY ACT AND THE INTERNAL REVENUE CODE GRANTING EMPLOYERS CREDIT OF ONE HUNDRED PER CENT OF THE AMOUNT OF CONTRIBUTIONS PAID INTO THE UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION FUND AS ESTABLISHED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW, AND ALSO PERMITTING THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS TO COLLECT THE FULL AMOUNT OF CONTRIBUTIONS FROM EMPLOYERS IN LIEU OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FOR THE PURPOSE OF FINANCING THE ADMINISTRATION EXPENSES OF THE MASSACHUSETTS EMPLOYMENT SECURITY LAW AND THE EMPLOYMENT SERVICE OF THE MASSACHUSETTS DIVISION OF EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

1 Resolved, That the general court of Massachusetts  
2 hereby urges the congress of the United States to  
3 enact forthwith legislation providing for the amend-  
4 ments to the social security act and the internal reve-

5 nue code granting employers a credit of one hundred  
6 per cent of the amount of contributions paid in due  
7 course into the unemployment compensation fund as  
8 established under the provisions of the Massachusetts  
9 employment security law, and also permitting the  
10 commonwealth of Massachusetts to collect the full  
11 amount of contributions from employers in lieu of  
12 the federal government so as to raise sufficient funds  
13 for the proper and efficient administration of the  
14 Massachusetts employment security law and the em-  
15 ployment service of the Massachusetts division of  
16 employment security; and be it further

17 *Resolved*, That copies of these resolutions be forth-  
18 with transmitted by the state secretary to the pre-  
19 siding officer of each branch of congress and the  
20 members thereof from this commonwealth.
