AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF CHELSEA TO PAY AN ANNUITY
TO PEARL MCGAULEY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. For the purpose of discharging a moral obliga-
2 tion, the city of Chelsea may appropriate and pay each year
3 the sum of fifteen hundred dollars to Pearl McGauley, the
4 widow of Walter McGauley, a former employee of said city.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance by
2 vote of the board of aldermen and the mayor of the city of
3 Chelsea, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not other-
4 wise.

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CITY OF CHICAGO AND TO REPEAL AN ACT
OF THE SAID CITY.

Enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in
their assembled body on the day of

SECTION 1. For the purpose of amending a certain ordinance
of the city of Chicago, to-wit: the ordinance which was passed
on the day of 1907, the sum of dollars to-wit: the
city of Chicago, a former owner of said city.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage by
the board of aldermen and the mayor of the city of
Chicago, subject to the provisions of its charter, but not otherwise.
