The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirty-Three.

An Act providing for the Extension and Repair of Certain Sea Walls and Other Shore Protection in the Town of Scituate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Subject to the conditions herein im-
2 posed, the department of public works is hereby
3 authorized and directed to build extensions to certain
4 sea walls and other shore protection and to repair
5 existing sea walls and other shore protection in the
6 town of Scituate for the purpose of protecting the
7 shore in said town from erosion by the sea. No work
8 shall be begun until the town of Scituate has assumed
9 liability, in the manner provided by section twenty-
10 nine of chapter ninety-one of the General Laws, for
11 all damages that may be incurred hereunder, nor
12 until there has been paid into the treasury of the
13 commonwealth by the county of Plymouth the sum
14 of eighteen thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars,
15 and by said town of Scituate the sum of eighteen
16 thousand seven hundred and fifty dollars, which to-
17 gether with such sum, not exceeding thirty-seven
18 thousand five hundred dollars, as may hereafter be
19 appropriated by the commonwealth, shall constitute

20 a fund for the improvements herein authorized; pro-
21 vided, that the total cost of such improvement shall
22 not exceed seventy-five thousand dollars and pro-
23 vided, further, that if any of the aforesaid sum re-
24 mains after the completion of such improvements
25 one fourth of such remainder shall be repaid to said
26 county and one fourth thereof shall be repaid to said
27 town.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose of meeting the pay-
2 ments required to be made by the county of Plymouth
3 under this act, the treasurer of said county, with the
4 approval of the county commissioners, may borrow
5 from time to time, on the credit of the county, such
6 sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggre-
7 gate, eighteen thousand seven hundred and fifty dol-
8 lars, and may issue bonds or notes of the county
9 therefor, which shall bear on their face the words,
10 "Plymouth County—Scituate Sea Wall Loan, Act of
11 1933". Each authorized issue shall constitute a
12 separate loan, and such loans shall be payable in
13 not more than five years from their dates. Such
14 bonds or notes shall be signed by the treasurer of the
15 county and countersigned by a majority of the county
16 commissioners. The county may sell the said se-
17 curities at public or private sale upon such terms and
18 conditions as the county commissioners may deem
19 proper, but not for less than their par value. In-
20 debtedness incurred under this act shall, except as
21 herein provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of
22 the General Laws.

1 SECTION 3. The county treasurer, with the ap-
2 proval of the commissioners, may issue temporary

3 notes of the county, payable in not more than one
4 year from their dates, in anticipation of the issue of
5 serial bonds or notes under the preceding section, but
6 the time within which such serial bonds or notes shall
7 become due and payable shall not, by reason of such
8 temporary notes, be extended beyond the time fixed
9 by said section. Any notes issued in anticipation of
10 the serial bonds or notes shall be paid from the pro-
11 ceeds thereof.

1 SECTION 4. For the purpose of meeting the pay-
2 ments required to be made by the town of Scituate
3 under this act, said town may borrow from time to
4 time such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding
5 in the aggregate, eighteen thousand seven hundred
6 and fifty dollars, and may issue notes therefor, which
7 shall bear on their face the words, "Town of Scituate,
8 Sea Wall Loan, Act of 1933". Each authorized issue
9 shall constitute a separate loan, and such loans shall
10 be paid within five years from their dates. Indebt-
11 edness incurred by said town under this act shall be
12 in excess of the statutory limit, but shall, except as
13 herein provided, be subject to chapter forty-four of
14 the General Laws.

1 SECTION 5. This act shall take full effect upon its
2 acceptance during the current year by vote of the
3 county commissioners of Plymouth county and by
4 vote of the town of Scituate in town meeting and the
5 filing in the office of the said department of certified
6 copies of said votes.
