AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE SALE OF REAL ESTATE BY THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (b) of section 5 of chapter 161A of the General
2 Laws, inserted therein by section 18 of chapter 563 of the acts
3 of 1964, is hereby amended by striking out the last sentence and
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentences: — Such real
5 property shall be sold to the highest bidder therefor; provided,
6 that if, in the judgment of the directors, no satisfactory bid is
7 obtained, the authority shall have the right to reject all bids and
8 to re-advertise for bids. If, after such re-advertisement, no
9 satisfactory bid is received, the authority may sell the real estate
10 without competitive bidding.
