**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXEMPTING CERTAIN MOTION PICTURE OPERATORS OR PROJECTIONISTS FROM THE LAW RELATIVE TO OBSCENE SHOWS OR ENTERTAINMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 31 of chapter 272 of the General Laws  
2 is hereby amended by adding at the end the following sen-  
3 tence:—The provisions of this section shall not apply to a  
4 motion picture operator or projectionist licensed under sec-  
5 tions seventy-five or seventy-six of chapter one hundred and  
6 forty-three and employed by a person licensed under section  
7 one hundred and eighty-one of chapter one hundred and  
8 forty and section thirty-four of chapter one hundred and  
9 forty-three, provided that such operator or projectionist has  
10 no financial interest in the place wherein he is so employed.

1 SECTION 2. Section 32 of said chapter 272 is hereby amended  
2 by adding at the end the following sentence:—The provi-  
3 sions of this section shall not apply to a motion picture  
4 operator or projectionist licensed under section seventy-five  
5 or seventy-six of chapter one hundred and forty-three and  
6 employed by a person licensed under section one hundred  
7 and eighty-one of chapter one hundred and forty and section  
8 thirty-four of said chapter one hundred and forty-three,  
9 provided that such operator or projectionist has no financial  
10 interest in the place wherein he is so employed.
