AN ACT

Making Appropriations for the Salaries and Expenses of the
Massachusetts Highway Commission.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the
same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The sums hereinafter mentioned are ap-
2 propriated, to be paid out of the treasury of the common-
3 wealth, from the ordinary revenue, for the salaries and
4 expenses of the Massachusetts highway commission, for
5 the fiscal year ending on the thirtieth day of November,
6 nineteen hundred and eleven, to wit: —

7 For the salaries of the commissioners, the sum of eighty-
8 five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 47, sect. 1.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$8,500.)

9 For the salaries of the engineers, clerks and assistants,
10 a sum not exceeding twenty-one thousand five hundred dol-
11 lars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 47.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$20,000.)

12 For travelling and other expenses of the commission, a
13 sum not exceeding thirty-five hundred dollars. (Rev.
14 Laws, ch. 47.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$4,000.)

15 For postage, printing and other necessary office ex-
16 penses, including printing and binding the annual report,
17 a sum not exceeding sixty-five hundred dollars. (Rev.
18 Laws, ch. 47.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$6,000.)

19 For rent of offices, a sum not exceeding forty-seven hun-
20 dred and fifty dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch. 47.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$4,750.)

21 For care and repair of road-building machinery, a sum
22 not exceeding sixty-five hundred dollars. (Rev. Laws, ch.
23 47, sect. 19.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$3,000.)

24 For the maintenance of state highways, for the present
25 and previous years, a sum not exceeding two hundred
26 thousand dollars. (Acts 1904, ch. 244; 1908, ch. 642.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$200,000.)

27 For the suppression of the gypsy and brown-tail moths
28 and other insect pests which threaten the trees on state
29 highways, a sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars.
30 (Acts 1908, ch. 642.)

(Appropriation 1910, \$10,000.)

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
