By Mrs. Cleven of Chelmsford, petition of Carol C. Cleven and Nancy H. Evans relative to the tuition of certain non-resident public school students. Education, Arts and Humanities.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE TUITION OF CERTAIN NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 304 of chapter 138 of the acts of 1991 is hereby amended
2 by adding the following two paragraphs: —

3 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or any other
4 general or special law by the contrary, a school district may
5 continue to accept a student, or their sibling or step sibling, who
6 no longer resides in that school district on a private tuition basis;
7 provided, however, that said student attended said school dis-
8 trict in the current or preceding school year. The tuition charged
9 by the school district may not exceed the average cost of said
10 student's education. This paragraph shall not preclude any school
11 system from admitting children under the provisions of section
12 twelve B of chapter seventy-six of the General Laws.

13 Notwithstanding the provisions of this section or any other
14 general or special law to the contrary, any school district that
15 chooses, through the collective bargaining agreement, to admit
16 children of faculty, may continue to do so on that basis. The terms
17 of any such acceptance shall be in accordance with the collective
18 bargaining agreement and shall not preclude any school district
19 from admitting children under the provisions of section twelve B
20 of chapter seventy-six of the General Laws.
