AN ACT RELATIVE TO EXPENDITURES BY EXECUTORS AND ADMINISTRATORS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF BURIAL LOTS AND MONUMENTS. Chap. 46

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section twelve of chapter one hundred and fifty of the Revised Laws is hereby amended by inserting after the word "monument", in the second line, the words: —, or for the repair, improvement or embellishment of a burial lot or monument, — so as to read as follows: — *Section 12.* A reasonable amount expended for a burial lot and a monument, or for the repair, improvement or embellishment of a burial lot or monument, may be allowed by the court as part of the funeral expenses of a testator or intestate and the court may at any time, upon petition of an executor or administrator, after notice, determine the amount which may be expended.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE LICENSING OF OUTDOOR EXHIBITIONS AND PUBLIC ENTERTAINMENTS. Chap. 47

*Be it enacted, etc., as follows:*

Section one hundred and seventy-six of chapter one hundred and two of the Revised Laws, as amended by chapter one hundred and ninety of the acts of nineteen hundred and six, is hereby further amended by striking out the said section and substituting the following: — *Section 176.* The mayor of any city except Boston, and in Boston, the licensing board, and the selectmen of any town, may grant a license to any person to establish, keep open and maintain a skating rink to be used for roller skating, carrousels, inclined railways, ferris wheels and outdoor exhibitions of fire fighting for the amusement of the public, for hire, gain or reward upon such terms, conditions and regulations as they deem proper, subject to sections one hundred and eighty-six to one hundred and eighty-nine, inclusive, as amended, and to the provisions of law relating to the observance of the Lord's day.
