AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONSTRUCT A PEDESTRIAN OVERPASS OVER ROUTE 128 AT GRANT CIRCLE IN THE CITY OF GLOUCESTER.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to construct a pedestrian overpass over Route 128 at
- 3 Grant Circle in the city of Gloucester.

Report of the Committee on the Administration of the Government

The Committee on the Administration of the Government, created by the House of Representatives on February 2, 1901, has the honor to report to the House the results of its investigation into the administration of the Government during the past year.

The Committee has found that the administration of the Government has been marked by a general feeling of dissatisfaction among the people, and that the Government has failed to meet the expectations of the people in many respects.

The Committee has also found that the Government has been inefficient in its management, and that the public funds have been carelessly expended. It is therefore recommended that the Government be reorganized and that the public funds be more carefully managed.
