AN ACT RELATIVE TO APPRENTICE TRAINING.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The use of the terms "apprentice" or "apprentice training" in any
2 advertisement for or notice of employment, posting or job applica-
3 tion shall be prohibited unless accompanied by the approved appren-
4 tice training program number as defined by the division. Said
5 number shall be clearly visible and of the same print size and type
6 used in the body of the advertisement, posting or application.

7 Any employer, contractor, subcontractor or other entity who bids
8 on a public project which is subject to the provisions of MGL
9 Chapter 149, Section 44A-44J, inclusive, or MGL Chapter 30,
10 Section 39M must submit with the official bid document an
11 approved apprentice training program number, unless the employer,
12 contractor, subcontractor or other entity has determined that it will
13 not employ apprentices on said public project for the duration of the
14 project.

15 Any violation of this section shall be considered a violation of the
16 apprentice program.
