SENATE No. 332

By Mr. Chase, petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 332) of Arthur E. Chase for legislation to limit the amount of total lottery revenue dedicated to the payment of prizes to forty-nine percent. Government Regulations.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

AN ACT LIMITING THE AMOUNT OF TOTAL LOTTERY REVENUES DEDICATED TO THE PAYMENT OF PRIZES TO 49%.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section twenty-five of chapter ten of the General
2 Laws is hereby amended by striking clause (a) and inserting in
3 place thereof the following clause: —

4 (a) the payment of prizes to the holders of winning tickets or
5 shares which in any case shall be no less than forty-five percent,
6 and no more than forty-nine percent, of the total revenues
7 accruing from the sale of lottery tickets.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
