

HOUSE No. 710

By Mr. Businger of Brookline, petition of John A. Businger for legislation to reduce the age of eligibility for real estate tax exemptions to age sixty-five. Taxation.

AN ACT REDUCING THE AGE OF ELIGIBILITY FOR REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS TO AGE SIXTY-FIVE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Clause forty-one of section 5 of chapter 59 of the
2 General Laws, as most recently amended by section 1 of chapter
3 1069 of the acts of 1971, is hereby further amended by striking out
4 in the first sentence wherever appearing, the word "seventy" and
5 inserting in place thereof the word "sixty-five".

- 1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
