AN ACT TO PRODUCE UNIFORMITY IN PRODUCTION OF CERTIFIED PAYROLL RECORDS AND TO INCREASE THE APPLICATION OF CERTAIN LAWS RELATING TO PUBLIC WORKS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 149, Section 27B of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition of the Massachusetts
3 General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out the first
4 paragraph of said section and inserting in place thereof the
5 following: —

6 Section 27B. Every contractor, subcontractor or public body
7 engaged in said public works to which sections twenty-seven,
8 twenty-seven A, twenty-seven F and twenty-seven G apply shall
9 keep a true and accurate record of all mechanics and apprentices,
10 teamsters, chauffeurs and laborers employed thereon, showing the
11 name, address, social security number and occupational classifi-
12 cation of each such employee on said works, and the hours worked
13 by, and the wages paid to, each such employee, and shall furnish
14 to the Commissioner, upon his request, a copy of said record,
15 signed by the employer or his authorized agent under the penalties
16 of perjury on form(s) approved or prescribed by the Commis-
17 sioner. Such records shall be open to inspection by any authorized
18 representative of the Department at any reasonable time, and as
19 often as may be necessary.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 149, Section 27B of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the words “under the
3 provision of” in the Statement of Compliance the following: —
4 “Sections twenty-seven, twenty-seven F and twenty-seven G of
5 Chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws.”

1 SECTION 3. Chapter 149, Section 27C of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting after the words “violation of any
3 provision of” appearing in the second sentence the following: —
4 “sections twenty-six, twenty-seven, twenty-seven B, twenty-
5 seven F and twenty-seven G of chapter one hundred and forty-
6 nine of the General Laws.”

1 SECTION 4. Chapter 149, Section 27C of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “provision of said
3 section” appearing in the third sentence the following: — “twenty-
4 six, twenty-seven, twenty-seven F and twenty-seven G of chapter
5 one hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws.”

1 SECTION 5. Chapter 149, Section 27C of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “provision of said
3 sections” appearing in the fourth sentence, the following: —
4 “twenty-six, twenty-seven, twenty-seven F and twenty-seven G of
5 chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws.”

1 SECTION 6. Chapter 149, Section 27C of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting, after the words, “provision of said
3 sections” appearing in the fifth sentence, the following: —
4 “twenty-six, twenty-seven, twenty-seven F and twenty-seven G of
5 chapter one hundred and forty-nine of the General Laws.”

1 SECTION 7. Chapter 149, Section 27F of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by inserting, after the words “not less than”
3 appearing in the fifth sentence, the following: — “ten thousand
4 dollars.”
