

Chap. 21. RESOLVE CONTINUING THE INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE PUBLIC ACCESS BOARD OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE GENERAL LAWS RELATIVE TO SHORE RESERVATIONS AND PUBLIC LANDINGS.

Resolved, That the public access board is hereby authorized and directed to continue the investigation and study authorized by chapter sixty of the resolves of nineteen hundred and sixty-seven. Said board shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the third Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.

Chap. 22. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION BY THE JUDICIAL COUNCIL RELATIVE TO OBJECTIONS OF DEFENDANTS IN CRIMINAL CASES.

Resolved, That the judicial council be requested to investigate the subject matter of current house document numbered 1813, relative to objections of defendants in criminal cases, and to include its conclusions and its recommendations, if any, in relation thereto, together with drafts of such legislation as may be necessary to give effect to the same, in its annual report for the current year. *Approved April 22, 1968.*

Chap. 23. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE GROUP INSURANCE COMMISSION RELATIVE TO AUTHORIZING SAID COMMISSION TO ESTABLISH SELF-INSURANCE PROGRAMS IN LIEU OF THE PRESENT SYSTEM FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

Resolved, That the group insurance commission is hereby authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of the subject matter of current senate documents numbered 41, authorizing the group insurance commission to establish self-insurance programs in lieu of the present system for state employees; and 290, authorizing the group insurance commission to establish a self-insurance program in lieu of the present system for state employees. Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or before the third Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.

Chap. 24. RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY THE RETIREMENT LAW COMMISSION RELATIVE TO CERTAIN BENEFITS PROVIDED FOR WIDOWS AND WIDOWERS UNDER THE RETIREMENT LAW AND THE FEASIBILITY OF INCREASING SUCH BENEFITS.

Resolved, That the retirement law commission is hereby authorized and directed to make an investigation and study of the subject matter of current senate document numbered 546, providing survivor benefits
