The committee on Bills in the Third Reading, to whom was referred the Bill providing that the honor roll erected on the U.S.S. Massachusetts to honor those individuals from the Commonwealth who died in the service of their country during World War II shall also include a section honoring citizens of the Commonwealth who died in the Persian Gulf War, otherwise known as Operation Desert Storm (House, No. 5582), reports recommending that the same be amended by the substitution of the accompanying bill (House, No. 5635).

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE HONOR ROLL ERECTED ON THE U.S.S. MASSACHUSETTS INCLUDE A SECTION HONORING THE CITIZENS OF THE COMMONWEALTH WHO DIED IN THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 124A of chapter 6 of the General Laws,
2 as appearing in the 1988 Official Edition, is amended by inserting
3 in line 17, after the figure "II" the words: — and the Persian Gulf
4 War also known as Operation Desert Storm.

1 SECTION 2. Said section 124A of said chapter 6, as so
2 appearing is hereby further amended by striking out, in line 17,
3 the word "war" and inserting in place thereof the word: — wars.
