AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MARCH SEVENTEENTH SHALL BE A LEGAL HOLIDAY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 7 of chapter 4 of the General Laws, as amended, is  
2 hereby further amended by inserting in clause Eighteenth,  
3 as most recently amended by chapter 241 of the acts of 1948,  
4 immediately after the words "February twenty-second" and  
5 immediately before the words "April nineteenth," the words:  
6 — March seventeenth.
