The committee on Pensions and Old Age Assistance, to whom was referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 408) of Joseph D. Ward, William D. Weeks and another for legislation to provide for the retention in service beyond the maximum age for retirement of certain skilled persons; the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 666) of Maurice A. Donahue for legislation to provide that John L. Brocklesby, Deputy Master of Middlesex County House of Correction at Billerica be classified in Group I under the contributory law; so much of the recommendation of the Department of Mental Health (House, No. 52) as relates to authorizing the continued employment of certain House No. 55 skilled persons on an emergency basis after their retirement; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 433) of the Massachusetts Civic League that provision be made for the continuance in employment or the re-employment of certain public employees after having reached age seventy; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1289) of Philip N. Carney for legislation to authorize the continued employment of certain public employees after age seventy whether or not said employees are members of a contributory retirement system; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1492) of William D. Weeks, Alfred R. Shrigley and another for legislation to permit continued employment after age seventy of certain physicians in the state service whether or not they are members of a contributory retirement system, report the accompanying Bill (Senate, No. 732). (Representatives Healy of Charlemont and Starr of Belmont dissenting).

AN ACT EXTENDING THE PERIOD DURING WHICH CERTAIN SKILLED
PERSONS MAY BE EMPLOYED SUBSEQUENT TO RETIREMENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The first sentence of section 91 of chapter 32 of the Gen-
2 eral Laws, as most recently amended by section 2 of Chapter
3 749 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by striking
4 out, in line 20 the words "one year" and inserting in place
5 thereof the words "five years".
