DECISION

Three Way Enterprises, Inc. dba 3 Ways Liquors (“licensee”) holds an all alcohol license issued pursuant to Massachusetts General Laws chapter 138, §15. The Alcoholic Beverages Control Commission (“the Commission”) held a hearing on June 22, 2010 regarding an alleged violation of Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. Prior to the commencement of the hearing, the licensee stipulated to the violation alleged in Investigator Jamie Binienda’s Compliance Check Field Report.

The following documents are in evidence:

1. Licensee’s Stipulation of Facts; and
2. Compliance Check Field Report of Investigator Jamie Binienda.

There is one (1) tape of this hearing.

Facts

1. On Wednesday, May 5, 2010 at approximately 7:40 p.m., Commission Investigators conducted a Minimum Age Purchase Law Compliance Check at the licensed premises of 3 Way Liquors.
2. An underage operative, working with the investigators, purchased an alcoholic beverage for \$3.50. The clerk did not ask the underage operative for identification.

Conclusion

Based on the evidence, the Commission finds the licensee violated Massachusetts General Laws c. 138, §34. The Commission **suspends the license for three (3) days.**
