

able funds the sum of six hundred and ninety-six dollars and fifty-one cents to Velma M. O'Donnell for services rendered by her as temporary junior clerk in the office of the clerk of the second district court of Barnstable at Provincetown during the months of August, September and October in the year nineteen hundred and sixty-four, and such sum shall be included in the appropriation for the current year for said county.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

Chap. 492. AN ACT DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO PERMIT THE ERECTION OF A CERTAIN STATUE ON LAND OF SAID COMMISSION IN THE SOUTH BOSTON DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized and directed to permit the erection of a statue in memory of Father Joseph LaPorte, a beloved former parish priest in the South Boston district of the city of Boston, on such portion of the median strip of land on Columbia road in said district in the vicinity of the entrance of the L Street Bathhouse as said commission shall designate. Said commission shall maintain the grounds surrounding such statue upon its erection.

Chap. 493. AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE DIVISION OF FISHERIES AND GAME TO ACQUIRE CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWNS OF WARE AND BELCHERTOWN FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE MANAGEMENT PURPOSES.

Be it enacted, etc., as follows:

For the purpose of establishing a public area for fishing, hunting, and the management thereof, the division of fisheries and game in the department of natural resources is hereby authorized to acquire, on behalf of the commonwealth, by eminent domain, or by purchase or otherwise, such lands and waters as are situated in the towns of Ware and Belchertown, bounded on the north by Route 9, on the east by land owned by the metropolitan district commission upon which the Chicopee Aqueduct is located, on the west by the west bank of the Swift river and on the south by Cold Spring road, and including the bottom of the Swift river extending south from Cold Spring road to the crossing of the Chicopee Aqueduct, and including two right-of-way locations for the above described tract to River road. Said land shall not include buildings or the lots they are presently located upon, nor any tracts or facilities now owned by any agency of the federal government, nor any land now owned by the metropolitan district commission. All lands acquired hereunder shall be added to and become a part of the Swift River Wildlife Management Area. The attorney general shall approve, as to form, the deeds necessary for carrying out the purposes of this act.
